ASHEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA

Uprooted trees and extensive debris were intensified by the extreme winter conditions. Our team worked alongside Mission to North America, cleaning up properties, removing trees and debris. Skid Steer froze. So did the team. But that didn't dampen their spirit as they helped families in need



SWANNANOVA, NORTH CAROLINA

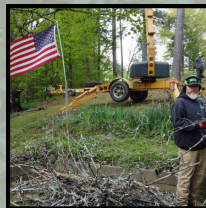
Roads and buildings were buried in debris because of the flooding. The group of young adults from Michigan that we led did a fantastic job. Everything from repairing flood damaged homes to crawling underneath houses to install insulation. Our team served as the hands and feet of Jesus, cleaning up the mess and even blessing a local church with a special building project.



Spring 2025

DALLAS, GEORGIA / CALHOUN, GEORGIA

Severe storms generated tornadoes that wreaked havoc outside Dallas and Calhoun. Our team removed trees from roofs and cleared away debris, serving 20 families in these communities.



LONDON, KENTUCKY / MORGANFIELD, KENTUCKY

An EF-4 Tornado ravaged London while an EF-3 ripped through Morganfield. Residents described it as "roaring like a freight train," followed by the sudden destruction of everything around them. Our team partnered with Cedarcrest Church, He Restores, and God's Pit Crew to help mitigate the devastation. We pulled trees off houses, cars, and driveways, rebuilding hope one family at a time.

DALTON, GEORGIA

Group training introduced volunteers to our mission. They also received training in safe chain saw and skid steer operation.



CLOSING A CHAPTER / RETURN TO FOCUS

Our local service teams constructed 11 wheel chair ramps and repaired and replaced 3 roofs. What a great way to close this chapter of our ministry and focus on disaster relief and recovery.

FORT OGLETHORPE, GEORGIA

We partnered with ServeComm, Cedarcrest Church and He Restores after the flood, clearing debris, ensuring families were fed. Mobile laundry services cleaned and dried clothes for residents.
