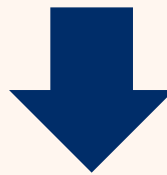


God's Faithfulness

As we reflect on this year, we are overwhelmed by the faithfulness of God and the incredible opportunities we've had to serve communities impacted by natural disasters. Your prayers, support, and encouragement have made all of this possible. Here is a look back at how God has used Rebuilding Hope to bring relief and restoration in 2024.

Conyers, GA - Tornado Relief

At the beginning of the year, we responded to a devastating tornado that tore through Conyers, Georgia. Families were left with damaged homes and broken spirits. By God's grace, we were able to pull trees off houses, garages, and carports, helping homeowners begin to rebuild. We also witnessed God's hand as neighbors came together to support one another, and many were reminded that they are not alone in their struggles.



Valdosta, GA - Hurricane Helene Recovery

When Hurricane Helene swept through Valdosta, Georgia, the destruction was significant and widespread. Fallen trees, debris, and water damage left families in urgent need of help. Our team stepped in, not just to clear away the physical damage, but to offer hope and prayer to those affected. We were reminded of God's promise in Isaiah 41:10: "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."

Douglas, GA - Continuing the Work

After a couple of weeks in Valdosta, we felt called to move our work to Douglas GA; a smaller town that was also in great need of help. This storm was so widespread with needs from Florida to Virginia. In Douglas, we encountered families who had been waiting weeks for help. With every tree we removed and every piece of debris we cleared, we were able to share the love of Christ in practical ways and truly be the hands and feet of Christ.



God's Timing

One story that stands out is that of Ms. Carter, a woman deeply affected by the hurricane. She had been without water and electricity for nearly three months, all while juggling the care of family members in the hospital. She barely had time to care for herself amidst these overwhelming challenges. One afternoon while at Tractor Supply she ran into a few of our team members and expressed her need for home repairs and tree removal. We removed more than a dozen trees, repaired her water line, and reinstalled her electrical meter restoring both water and power to her home. Through tears of gratitude, Ms. Carter shared how she felt God's presence and provision in her life, even in the hardest times. This moment reminded us that our work goes far beyond physical restoration—it's about bringing hope and showing the love of Christ.



Asheville, NC

We closed out the year by taking a trip to Asheville, North Carolina, to continue assisting with cleanup from Hurricane Helene. We worked alongside many other dedicated individuals and organizations seeking to share Jesus in the midst of difficult circumstances. While the needs are changing constantly, we trust that God is at work, preparing hearts and opening doors for ministry and orchestrating each step of this process. As we move forward into the New year we are thoughtfully and prayerfully considering where He is calling us next and would appreciate your prayers for guidance.



Asheville - Wind & Water

During our time in Asheville we helped a family who lost everything as a result of the flooding, including their house, cars, even the bridge to access their property. We cleared the lot where their old home was to clear the way for a new trailer to be brought in. We prayed with them and gave them a Bible, seeking to meet not only their physical needs but their spiritual needs, too.
